This exquisite piece is meticulously handcrafted by Japanese artisans renowned for their world-class skills and is entirely crafted in Japan.

Japan possesses a wealth of splendid traditional techniques that have been handed down through generations. Yet, challenges such as aging artisans and a shortage of successors are contributing to the decline of these crafts. Metal casting is among these venerable arts facing such challenges.

Nevertheless, amidst these challenges, there are artisans possessing world-class skills and unwavering passion today. We are committed to preserving and showcasing the magnificent craftsmanship of these Japanese artisans on the global stage. With this goal in mind, we aim to integrate their expertise into art that will endure for the next 100 years.

A skull symbolizes regeneration, embodying both death and the emergence of life. It represents the delicate balance between existence and mortality, a theme that resonates deeply in our daily lives and in the perpetual struggle where death looms nearby. The skull motif, portrayed in countless paintings and artworks, has maintained a timeless and profound connection with humanity since ancient times, serving as a universal symbol.

The decline and subsequent resurgence of Japanese craftsmanship marks a story of regeneration. Crafting a flawless metal artwork depicting a skull represents a groundbreaking innovation in Japanese casting expertise and embodies a bold challenge undertaken in the quest for revival.

ART OF WAR has carefully considered this project over an extended period, overcoming numerous obstacles, and has now successfully completed The Skull Knight.

Craftsmanship and Design: Detailing The Skull Knight

A metal statue featuring such exceptional quality in a skull motif would be difficult to find elsewhere in the world. This masterful craftsmanship embodies the aspirations for the revitalization of Japanese craftsmanship and the ambitious spirit of elite Japanese artisans.

Despite its modest dimensions—measuring just 8cm in length and weighing 0.9kg—this statue exemplifies exquisite craftsmanship, accentuated by its compact size. Additionally, its detachable head offers a dual purpose, functioning not only as a piece of art but also as a ring. This innovative concept transcends traditional perceptions of artwork, providing enjoyment in both forms.

The pedestal, symbolizing the torso, is meticulously crafted from pewter, an ancient material known for its minimal oxidation and rich, deep metallic finish compared to silver. By employing metals, the goal is to create enduring artwork capable of lasting a hundred years. Conversely, the head is fashioned from 925 sterling silver, highlighting its delicate brilliance and texture. The use of distinct materials for the torso and head enhances the unique textures and characters of each, complementing one another seamlessly.

Was the armor worn by the skull something he wore in life, or does it symbolize evidence of his past as a king? The skull, representing both life and death, evokes contradictions while also conveying a profound sense of impermanence. How do you interpret The Skull Knight?
